## Pelagic trawlers in Western Sahara waters : an organized plunder ?

The Western Sahara (Arabic: العربية Aṣ-Ṣaḥrā' al-Gharbīyah, Spanish & French: Sahara Occidental) is a disputed territory in North Africa, bordered by Morocco to the north, Algeria to the northeast, Mauritania to the east and south, and the Atlantic Ocean to the west. Its surface area amounts to 266,000 square kilometres. It is one of the most sparsely populated territories in the world, mainly consisting of desert flatlands.


Since a United Nations-sponsored ceasefire agreement in 1991, most of the territory (including the entire Atlantic coast line) has been controlled by Morocco, strongly backed by France, and the remainder by the Sahrawi Arab Democratic Republic (SADR) (exiled government in Tindouf, Algeria), strongly backed by Algeria.

Despite the UN report regarding the exploration of oil off the coast of Western Sahara, the European Union wants to exploit fishing resources in waters outside Western Sahara and has signed a fishing treaty with Morocco.

In a confidential legal opinion (published in 23 February 2010), the European Parliament's Legal Service opined that fishing by European vessels under a current EU - Morocco fishing agreement covering the Western Sahara's waters is in violation of international law.

Through AIS internet-services, we can easily see that MANY large pelagic trawlers of various nationalities rush right now in Western Sahara coastal waters, especially in the vicinity of **Dajla** (Al **Dakhla**), a city which has harbour facilities for such large vessels.

For example, I could identify and follow 26 (twenty-six) fishing vessels in just 3 days (15 to 17 august 2011) which were active at 5 to 40 miles from Dajla. See Table below (next page).




AIS-emitting fishing vessels around Dajla (Al Dakhla) on 17-august-2011
